1. Date:

Weapons Control will also be available one hour before each event.

6. Participants

There is no limit on the number of fencers that may enter from each country. Participants must be a member of their National fencing Federation.

Open Events

Participants for Open (Senior) Events must be born in 2001 or earlier.

Under-23 Events

Participants for Under-23 Events must be born between 1991 and 2001 (both years inclusive).

Veterans Events

Participants for Veterans Events must be born in 1964 or earlier.

7. Entries and Fees

All entries must be made by individual fencers using the AFF's online registration system, which is found here:

https://www.registernow.com.au/secure/Register.aspx?ID=12315.

The link to this can also be found on the AFF web site home page: www.fencing.org.au (AFC2: Overseas Competitors). Entries may be paid by debit or credit card (only) in AUD. No cash or bank transfer options are available.

Competitors may enter multiple events (both by weapon and age group).

- Normal Entry online, by 24 May 2014 (Saturday)
 - o Open event entries are \$75 per event
 - o Under-23 entries are \$75 per event
 - Veteran event entries are \$75 for one event, or \$95 for two or three events
- Late Entry online, between 25 May and 6 June 2014 (Friday)
 - o Open event entries are \$174 per event
 - o Under-23 entries are \$174 per event
 - Veteran event entries are \$75 for one event, or \$95 for two or three events

Note that the AFF charges a 4% transaction processing fee in addition to the fees above.

8. Competition Rules

The fencing tournament events will be conducted in accordance with the current Statutes and Rules of the FIE, qualified by the Australian rules as found on the AFF web site www.fencing.org.au, under the Competitions menu, Competition Rules & Policies option. The Directoire Technique shall deal with any unforeseen incidents not covered by the Rules.

9. Equipment

All equipment used must pass standard weapon and equipment tests as prescribed by the FIE, subject to AFF qualifications as found on the AFF web site www.fencing.org.au, under the Documents and Policies menu, All Documents and Policies option, Weapon Control Policy article. All equipment must be submitted for weapons testing individually by athletes and marked by the organisers before it can be used in the competition.

Mandatory protective clothing requirements are found on the AFF web site www.fencing.org.au, under Competitions menu, Equipment Requirements option. Note that female fencers without chest protectors will not be permitted to fence.

There will be opportunities to purchase equipment at the competition venue. Advance orders for pickup can be made via the equipment vendor, J G Fencing, at http://www.jgfencesport.com/.

10. Competition Management

Referees

There is no requirement for referees to be provided by participating countries. However, countries may offer the services of their referees for the event. Such referees must be properly attired in jacket / blazer and long pants. They are to be on duty under the assignment of the Directoire Technique throughout the competition, or as requested.

Directoire Technique (DT)

The DT shall be responsible for the technical organisation of the competition. The members will be appointed by the AFF in conjunction with Fencing SA. The decision of the DT shall be final.

Protests

Appeals against decisions of a referee should be immediately made by the competitors (only) to the referee, who will bring the complaint to the attention of the DT.

11. Medals and Prizes

Medals will be awarded to the first, second and equal third places in each event. In some events, medals are awarded to fifth to eighth places, or for specific age categories. Detailed information may be found in the AFF's National Competition Policy document, to be found on the AFF web site www.fencing.org.au, under the Competitions menu, Competition Rules & Policies option.

12. Transport and Accommodation

Competitors will need to arrange their own transport and accommodation. The venue is approximately 8km (15 minutes) from Adelaide Airport, and approximately 11km (20 minutes) from the Adelaide city centre – approximately \$25 by taxi.

The venue is also approximately 3km from Glenelg Beach, a popular South Australian tourist location, where there are a number of hotel and similar accommodation options. 15. General Information

Holidays

Monday 9 June is a Public Holiday in Adelaide. Many shops will not be open, although the tourist precinct of Glenelg will still be largely operating.

Currency

Australia's unit of currency is the Australia Dollar (AUD). Foreign currency can be exchanged freely at selected banks, most large hotels, and the airport. The current exchange rate is approximately AUD 1.10 for USD 1.00. Major credit cards are widely accepted in most places.

Visa Requirements

All people entering Australia must possess valid passports; participants are recommended to check with their local Australian Embassies for visa applications before traveling. Further information can be found on the Australian Government web site: http://www.immi.gov.au/Visit/Pages/Visit.aspx.

Weather

The weather in Adelaide during early June tends to be mild and occasionally rainy, with a daily average temperature range of 8°C to 16°C.

Water & Electricity

It is safe to drink water straight from the tap in Adelaide. However, for those who prefer bottled mineral water, any supermarket will have ample stocks.

Australia's voltage is 220-240 volts AC, 50 Hz. The power plugs used in Australia are unique to Australia, and adapters may be purchased at the airport or at many outdoor clothing and outfitters stores.

Tipping

Tipping in restaurants is not necessary, but certainly appreciated, 10% for good service is the usual figure. In bars and taxis, tipping is also not expected, although many people simply leave some of their coin change on the bar after picking up their drink, or tell the cabbie to "keep the change". Tipping in hotels is uncommon, though a small tip for carrying cases to a room would be fairly normal.

Smoking & Drinking

Smoking in almost all public places is against the law and subject to a fine. Smoking is also prohibited in all covered areas, including shopping centres, restaurants, cafes and bars (some have set up special smoking areas).

The legal drinking age in Australia is 18, and the consumption of alcohol on public transport and in some other controlled areas is prohibited.
